2. FACT Board & Wiltshire Council, Commissioning Team updates – Family Help &	
Family Hubs

- What is family help? In other spaces this would be called early help.	Thomas
- Some families need more help, but not social care. Want to harness the (ST)	IIIOIIIas

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- About having a joined up offer and reducing those hand overs that might occur at different ages. Make it easier for families to receive support.
- Don't want 50 people trying to support the same family. Ideally one, but may be more than that. As few as is possible – helps develop the relationship.
- The pilot occurring in Warminster & Westbury will help inform what the final offer looks like.
- Just about to go out to consultation ask families how & where they want to receive services.
- Will circulate information on training offer.
- Will reach out to the Forum about pilot if delivering support in the Warminster & Westbury area.
- Get involved! Want the widest involvement as possible to make it work and maximise resources.
- Working being down with integrated care need to have a conversation how these might dovetail.
- Mapping being done with BSW Academy of the training offer that the sector can offer back into the integrated care system.
- Could track the training needs alongside this.
- Families have told us there's confusion around online searches for support in Wiltshire. Aspiration to pull all the offer around family help onto a single platform – this will be Wiltshire Together.
- Will build on the success of the platform journey to get us there is ensuring the content we need is on there. Real will and commitment to make this happen and support organisations.
- Goal to get voluntary and community sector that aren't on there registered. Part of doing that is understanding why they're not already on there and how we get them on there.
- Going through the Forum members and looking to reach out to them to invite them to join.
- Currently 600 members and growing.
- The challenge is how to promote it to residents and make them aware of it.

- We're refining the profiles as everyone ticks everything in terms of what help they provide. What this means though is that when people search hundreds of results come back that aren't particularly targeted.

If your organisation has undertaken research that adds to our and others understanding to the challenges, opportunities and achievements of the sector and our communities please share it with others via this Hub, not only will it aide understanding, it will also be useful to support and inform our discussions with local, regional and national strategic stakeholders and also support other sector partners access funding.

- Undertaken in May/June time. Interested how people feel now and whether it still resonates with all the changes since then.
- Coming out of pandemic overall charities & non-profits feeling more optimistic than gloomy.
- 1 out of 3 have serious concerns about their future and challenges they
- 2 out of 3 starting to worry about cost of living crisis.
- Number of key challenges came out of the survey:
  - rising demand from people with anxiety, mental health issues, and concerns from those feeling isolated and lonely.
  - Concerns around funding.
  - Staff & volunteers
  - Digital Skills
- COVID had mixed impact on groups. Some reported it had little impact on their volunteers, staff, or funding. Some reporting they had more funding and volunteers than ever before. Others, approx. one third, feeling vulnerable about their future viability.
- Responses to lack of digital skills/innovation/hybrid working didn't feature too highly as an operational challenge.
- Next Volunteer Managers Forum October 20<sup>th</sup>. Can register <u>here</u>.
   It's a community of practice where volunteer managers share their experiences and support one another.
- 80% of organisations responding were impacted financially by COVID.
- If you have financial reserves, recommend having a reserve policy.

  Funders may look at your reserves and not give you the funding you're looking for if you don't have a policy stating why you have the amount you do.
